


### Web Transformation Goals



### **How Will Users Find Content?**

- 60% of users get directly to what they seek by Google search engine.
- Prominent site search box at the top of every page.
- Robust metadata allows for "create once, publish everywhere."
- Filters help users get to specific content in directories, e.g., news, species directory, permits, grants, rules/regs, publications, data/maps/tools.



### A Work in Progress – An Ongoing, Iterative Process

- Phase 1 national content is in.
- "Hybrid" site for a while—linking to current sites until all content migrated.
- Fixing bugs.
- Gathering and addressing feedback.
- Adding enhancements.
- More user testing.

### **Preparation for Council Sites**
