

WP Communication Challenges

- Time differences

 20 hours from HI
 to GU/CNMI,
 which is on other
 side of dateline
- Postal mail 7 to 10 days, w/ custom clearance and occasional theft in AS & CNMI



- Air travel time 6 hours to AS (2 flights/week), 8 hours to GU,
 10 hours plus to CNMI (stopovers in Guam or Tokyo)
- Poor internet and phone services in AS & CNMI

 Email, Drop Box, Google drive
- Advisory Body Teleconferences
 - Telephone for audio and webex to share PPTs and document
 - No video do to poor internet
- Council meeting webinar for public viewing

Communications with Advisory Panel

- Council communicates to AP through the AP subpanel chairs by email and phone
- AP subpanels meet before each Council meeting on their islands
- Council staff starts AP
 agenda draft with
 upcoming Council action
 items, facilitates meeting
 logistics & drafting report



Hawaii Advisory Sub-Panel

- AP subpanel chairs run the meeting and report recommendations at the Council meeting
- AP subpanel chairs are working on AP guidelines

Public Hearings

- Council decides on when and where hearings held, as long as they are held in the geographic area of concern
- A portion of Council meeting may be designated for the hearing



- Chair designates at least one Council member to preside over the hearing and is run within her/his discretion as long as all persons are afforded an opportunity to present their views
- Notice is placed in FR and local media
- Record obtained by tape recording, typewritten transcript or detailed minutes and maintained as part of the Council's administrative records
